



Alison E. Woodward (Ph.D. University of California, Berkeley) is Research Professor at the Free University of Brussels (VUB) and co-director of RHEA, the Center for Gender Studies and Diversity Research. She is a Senior Associate of the Institute for European Studies at the VUB. She worked for 15 years in Sweden at KTH and Uppsala University and has had guest positions at Ruhr University, Wayne State, the Science Center (WZB) in Berlin and other institutions. As a policy consultant she has assisted the European Commission, the European Economic and Social Committee, SCIENCE Europe, the Council of Europe, the United Nations and the Belgian and Flemish governments. Her research interests are in the field of comparative European Union public policy and organization, especially in the areas of civil society transnational mobilization, gender, migration, and equality. Transforming Gendered Well-Being in Europe: The Impact of Social Movements (Ashgate, 2011) and 'From Equal Treatment to Gender Mainstreaming and Diversity Management' in Gendering the European Union (J. Mushaben and G. Abels, eds.Palgrave Macmillan, 2012) and work on quota's in equality policy and the impact of austerity on civil society (Open Citizenship 2013 -4:112-21).
