During her career Mme Ameline has held numerous elective offices, such as Member of French Parliament, Minister for Gender, Equality and Equal Employment (2004-2005), Vice Chair of the French Consultative Commission on Human Rights (2005-2009), Ambassador with responsibility for social issues and gender equality French government, Delegate to the Governing Body of the International Labour Organization (ILO) (2005-2007), Minister Delegate for Gender, Equality and Equal Employment (2002-2004). In her career Mme. Nicole Ameline occupied the following posts: special assistant in the private office of the Minister of the Environment and Quality of Life (1978-1980), Secretary-General of the city of Honfleur and of Honfleur canton (1980-1987), Information Officer, Calvados General Council (1987-1990). Since 2013 Mme Ameline is Chair of CEDAW, United Nations.
