



Ms. Christina Hadulla-Kuhlmann studied law at Ruhr-Universität Bochum and Westfälische Wilhelms-Universität Münster. After completing her practical legal training, she practised her profession in a law firm and in an association. From 1992 onwards she was Deputy Head of the Legal Affairs Division of the then Federal Ministry of Education and Science (today's Federal Ministry of Education and Research, BMBF).
