Since 2005 AMONET has been engaged in clarifying and disseminating data on the impact of women in science in Portugal, monitoring changes and raising awareness on gender inequalities in academic careers. However, the ongoing economic crisis, coupled with a global trend to regulate work through new templates, structures and norms, is further disadvantaging women by posing additional constraints and barriers, resulting from an inbuilt gender bias. Securing top-level support for gender policy in research institutions and thus a sustainable gender equality, can only be reached after the implementation of structural changes an unpaved path awaiting to be explored.
