



Prof. Ineke Klinge is associate professor of Gender Medicine at Maastricht University. She combined her training in biomedical sciences (specialization Immunology) with gender research. The project GenderBasic (2005-2008) that she coordinated was elected by the European Commission as an excellent example of the positive impacts EU research can achieve. During winter semester 2008-09 she was a Maria-Goeppert-Mayer guest professor in Gender Medicine at the Georg-August-University in Göttingen, Germany. With Claudia Wiesemann she published the book Sex and Gender in Biomedicine: Theories, Methods, Results. At the European Science Open Forum (ESOF 2010) she organized the session: The Promises of Gender Medicine: are sex and gender the key to a better health care? She was responsible for the topic report (2011) Mainstreaming sex and gender in research of the Meta-Analysis of Gender and Science Research project. She was partner and steering board member of EUGiM (European Curriculum in Gender Medicine) and associate partner of ENGENDER (Inventory of good practices in Europe for promoting gender equity in health). With Londa Schiebinger she chaired the Expert Group "Innovation through Gender" financed by the European Commission, to develop the Gendered Innovations project (2011-2013). This project which developed methods of sex and gender analysis for basic and applied research was presented in a special session in the European Parliament on July 9, 2013.
